

# “We’re bringing you God’s love before His word”

- Pastor E. K. Duodu tells Kumasi residents at GCK Ghana Medical missions launch





**N**ational Overseer, Deeper Christian Life Ministry Ghana, Pastor E. K. Duodu, has unveiled a four-day Medical Missions to herald this month's Global Crusade with Kumuyi (GCK) which holds at the Baba Yara Sports Stadium in Kumasi. The initiative, according to him, was driven by the vision of Pastor (Dr.) W. F. Kumuyi, the Convener of GCK, and it is put together to provide essential medical services to the community ahead of the upcoming global crusade.

"This outreach is more than a medical mission; it is an expression of our collective commitment to the well-being of our brothers and sisters. We are here to provide not just medical care, but to extend a hand of friendship, love, and support to our community"

The outreach which holds from July 21 to 24, has assembled health professionals from Nigeria, Bulgaria, Germany, the United Kingdom, the United States, to be joined by their counterparts drawn from the Body of Christ in Ghana, to attend to patients in areas ranging from maternal health, eye care, dental care and general medical care. "This is a testament to the spirit of unity and the boundless

compassion that binds us together under the banner of the Global Crusade with Kumuyi", Pastor Duodu added for good measure. "This mission exemplifies the spirit of unity and compassion that underpins the GCK movement. Services will include maternal and general medical care, extending to inmates and staff of the Kumasi Central Prisons and Manhyia Prisons".

The National Overseer emphasized the broader significance of the outreach, quoting Mother Theresa: "Not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love." He highlighted the community-focused nature of the mission, noting that every act of care and kindness contributes to a healthier, happier society. The initiative also includes the provision of a mechanized borehole to the Brofoyedru community to improve access to clean water, alongside various sports activities.



# This is Christ's manifesto at work

**Dr. Rita Larsen-Reindorf, Deputy Director of Clinical Care at the Regional Health Administration in Ashanti, has commended the GCK-Ghana Medical Missions for its efforts in providing healthcare services to the community.**

Speaking at the inauguration of the medical missions, Dr. Larsen-Reindorf said, "What we have decided to do as a church is in the right direction. We are fulfilling the very ministry of Christ."

She emphasized that the Ghana Health Service believes in championing health, but originally, that is the ministry of Jesus Christ, with reference to Luke 4: 18-19.

Dr. Larsen-Reindorf expressed her excitement about the medical outreach programme, saying, "We say that health for all by 2030, but I tell you, we are very far away from it." She acknowledged that the formal health service could not achieve that goal alone and commended the Christian Community for its collaboration. "We need to collaborate with others, and so it's a delight that you have chosen to undertake this exercise."

Dr. Larsen-Reindorf also commended the church for its efforts in reaching out to the vulnerable in society. "The World Health Organization defines health as a state of complete well-being, physical, mental, and social, and not just the absence of disease."

"Let us be sensitive to that fact that there are people who will never read the Bible, the only Bible they will read is the love that we show to them."

The event was attended by the National Overseer of the Deeper Life Bible Church, other religious leaders, health professionals, and members of the Christian community.

Global Crusade with Kumuyi (GCK) has held monthly since July 2021 with rotating venues. The uniqueness of the GCK is in its ability to connect multiple countries in simultaneous worship with choirs located in various countries, taking turns to minister live from their locations during the event. It is a vision birthed by renowned international televangelist cum holiness preacher, Pastor (Dr) W. F. Kumuyi .
